With the summer holidays fast approaching we thought we would give you a brief reminder on Online Safety and the age restrictions on Social Media to keep your children safe. Please talk to your children about the on-line world and Social Media.

### Talk about their online world

We talk to children about crossing the road, bullying and speaking to strangers. But what about staying safe in the digital world?

Having regular conversations, about what your child is doing online - just like you would about their day at school—is the best way of keeping them safe.



You'll be able to spot any problems, encourage them to come to you if they're worried and make sure they know what's OK to share online - and what's not.

### 3 TIPS TO HELP START THE CONVERSATION

1. Explore sites and apps together and talk about any concerns.
2. Ask your child if they know how to stay safe online.
3. Talk about personal information and what to share online.

### REPORTING...

All apps/websites and social media platforms, all have reporting features in their settings.

We recommend that you know the apps/websites your children are using and always check the privacy setting.



SnapChat, used regularly by many children and young people, launched a new feature. SnapMaps allows users to see the location of their contacts. This feature allows others to accurately pinpoint where you are. There are three possible privacy settings:

- Ghost mode, where only you can see your position;
- My Friends mode, where any contact can see your location; and
- Select Friends mode, just those who you choose can see you
