Beginning

<p><u>AF1</u> <i>Use a range of strategies, including accurate decoding of text, to read for meaning</i></p>	<p>I can use more than one strategy, such as phonic, graphic, syntactic and contextual, in reading unfamiliar words and establishing meaning. I am beginning to use knowledge of alternative ways of pronouncing the same grapheme. I can identify syllables in order to read polysyllabic words. I can usually notice when reading does not make sense and self-corrects using knowledge of context and syntax. I can read on sight a limited range of medium frequency words (<i>e.g. Next 200 common words*</i>)</p>
<p><u>AF2</u> <i>Understand, describe, select or retrieve information, events or ideas from texts and use quotation and reference to text</i></p>	<p>I can read simple texts and show an understanding and it is generally accurate. I can show an understanding of a text by commenting on plot, setting & character. I am beginning to generate questions before reading and use my knowledge of non-fiction text structure (<i>e.g. use of index</i>) to begin to locate and retrieve specific information.</p>
<p><u>AF3</u> <i>Deduce, infer or interpret information, events or ideas from texts</i></p>	<p>I can express my opinions about major events or ideas in stories, poems and non-fiction. I can make predictions using experience of reading books written by the same author or based on similar themes. I can suggest alternative events that might have happened and gives reasons.</p>
<p><u>AF4</u> <i>Identify and comment on the structure and organisation of texts, including grammatical and literary features at text level</i></p>	<p>I can recognise the main features of page lay-out in texts (<i>e.g. title, sub-headings, labels, diagrams and charts in non-fiction and paragraphs in fiction</i>). I understand how to use alphabetically ordered texts to retrieve information.</p>
<p><u>AF5</u> <i>Explain and comment on the writers' use of language, including grammatical and literary features at word and sentence level</i></p>	<p>I am beginning to understand the effects of different words and phrases (<i>e.g. to create humour, images and atmosphere</i>).</p>
<p><u>AF6</u> <i>Identify and comment on writers' purposes and viewpoints and the overall effect of the text on the reader</i></p>	<p>I can make choices about which texts to read based on prior reading experience. I can express my likes and dislikes about texts, providing simple reasons.</p>
<p><u>AF7</u> <i>Relate texts to their social, cultural and historical contexts and literary traditions</i></p>	<p>I can make comparisons between books noting similarities and differences (<i>e.g. alternative versions of a traditional story</i>).</p>

<p><u>AF1</u> <i>Use a range of strategies, including accurate decoding of text, to read for meaning</i></p>	<p>I can recognise some common prefixes and suffixes and regular verb endings to construct the meaning of words in context. I can read aloud a simple unfamiliar text accurately and fluently with expression and intonation, taking account of the punctuation (<i>e.g. commas to mark pauses and grammatical boundaries</i>). I can read an increasing range of medium frequency words (<i>e.g. Next 200 common words*</i>) accurately and automatically.</p>
<p><u>AF2</u> <i>Understand, describe, select or retrieve information, events or ideas from texts and use quotation and reference to text</i></p>	<p>I can identify and comment on the main characters and how they relate to one another. I can re-tell stories, giving the main points clearly in sequence, with appropriate balance and detail.</p>
<p><u>AF3</u> <i>Deduce, infer or interpret information, events or ideas from texts</i></p>	<p>I can identify the key themes and discuss the reasons for events in stories. I can make simple inferences about thoughts and feelings and reasons for actions. I am beginning to evaluate the usefulness of information in texts for answering questions.</p>
<p><u>AF4</u> <i>Identify and comment on the structure and organisation of texts, including grammatical and literary features at text level</i></p>	<p>I can understand the main structural and page lay-out features of fiction and non-fiction texts. I can gain an overall impression of a text by making predictions about the content/subject of a book by skim reading, title, contents, and illustrations.</p>
<p><u>AF5</u> <i>Explain and comment on the writers' use of language, including grammatical and literary features at word and sentence level</i></p>	<p>I can talk about how different words or phrases affect the meaning.</p>
<p><u>AF6</u> <i>Identify and comment on writers' purposes and viewpoints and the overall effect of the text on the reader</i></p>	<p>I can respond to texts by discussing my preferences with reference to my favourite characters and books with similar themes.</p>

I can recognise a range of prefixes and suffixes to construct the meanings of words in context. I can read aloud with intonation and expression taking account of an increasing range of punctuation (<i>e.g. in dialogue</i>).</p>
<p><u>AF2</u> <i>Understand, describe, select or retrieve information, events or ideas from texts and use quotation and reference to text</i></p>	<p>I can identify the main points and summarise orally. I can make notes to summarise main points from a passage of text.</p>
<p><u>AF3</u> <i>Deduce, infer or interpret information, events or ideas from texts</i></p>	<p>I can explore the underlying themes and ideas, making clear references to text. I am beginning to justify my opinions about events and actions in text with reference to relevant parts of the text. I am beginning to make inferences about the thoughts and feelings of main characters, justifying views using evidence from text.</p>
<p><u>AF4</u> <i>Identify and comment on the structure and organisation of texts, including grammatical and literary features at text level</i></p>	<p>I can use my knowledge of the alphabet to locate books and find information. I understand how to use indexes to locate specific information. I understand the difference between prose and play scripts.</p>
